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**HOW MUCH DO WE “KNOW” ABOUT DRUGS FOR CHRONIC PAIN  
AND HOW DO WE “KNOW” IT?**

**Guest Speaker - Dr. Thomas Perry, Jr., MD, FRCP**

Dr. Perry will discuss the results of research conducted regarding drug treatment for chronic pain, at times presumed to be “neuropathic” in origin.

Dr. Perry is a Clinical Assistant Professor, Faculty of Medicine at UBC and Specialist Physician in general Internal Medicine and Clinical Pharmacology Chair, Education Working Group, Therapeutics Initiative.

Dr. Perry graduated from McGill University Medical School in 1978 and achieved his Fellowship in the Royal College of Physicians of Canada. He took additional training at the Karolinska Institute Department of Clinical Pharmacology in Stockholm in 1986 and at UBC until 1989 following which he was elected to the Legislative Assembly of BC where he served as Opposition Health Critic from 1989 – 1991. He was Minister for Advanced Education, Training & Technology from 1991 – 1993 and was an MLA from 1993 – 1996. He returned to clinical medicine in 1996 practicing general internal medicine at Delta Hospital, UBC Hospital and Vancouver General Hospital until 2014. He currently teaches clinical pharmacology through seminars, lectures and elective student clinical training at UBCH.
