THE IMPACT OF DISRUPTIVE PHYSICIAN BEHAVIOR AND WHAT WE CAN DO ABOUT IT

Guest Speaker - Dr. Tim Zmijowskyj, MD, CCFP

Dr. Zmijowskyj will provide a general overview of statistics involving areas of liability associated with medical malpractice cases and also will provide specific comments on disruptive behaviors, the impact that these can have on patient care, and the Canadian Medical Protective Association's initiatives to address the issue.

Dr. Zmijowskyj is the Physician Risk Manager, Safe Medical Care at the Canadian Medical Protective Association.

Dr. Zmijowskyj graduated from the University of Ottawa following which he completed his family medicine training in Northern Ontario. He practiced as a family physician in Sudbury, Ontario and in 2009, was recognized by the Ontario College of Family Physicians as the "Family Physician of the Year for Northern Ontario". He has worked as an educator, senior administrator and research. He has extensive experience working in rural northern communities, as well as with Aboriginal and underserved populations. In 2012, Dr. Zmijowskyj joined the CMPA as a physician risk manager.
