Mr. Dyer's presentation will focus on his experience as a recently retired Provincial Court Judge on how expert witnesses can, in his view, give their evidence and write their reports so as to be most helpful to the judge in a court hearing (or reading) their evidence.

Mr. Dyer will also discuss his view as to what lawyers presenting expert evidence in court should do in preparing their expert witnesses and qualifying and leading their direct evidence in a productive and favorable way for judges. He will welcome questions from the audience.

Mr. Dyer obtained his BA in Political Science at the University of Toronto, followed by a Masters in Political Science at Carleton University. He obtained his law degree at the University of Toronto and Master's Degree in Law at the London School of Economics.

Mr. Dyer practiced family and insurance law for 32 years, with some of his major clients being disability insurers. In 2005, he was appointed to the Provincial Court Bench and after 16 years, retired on April 1, 2021. While on the bench, he conducted 100s of trials in Family, Civil and Criminal cases, receiving expert evidence in all three types of cases.
